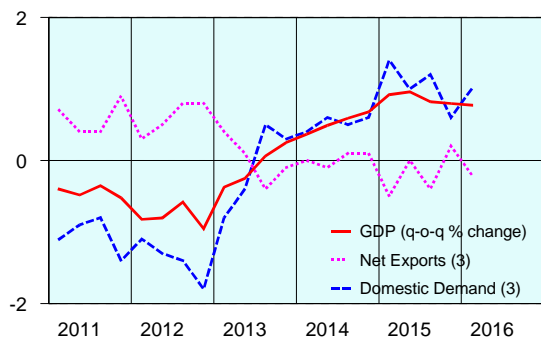

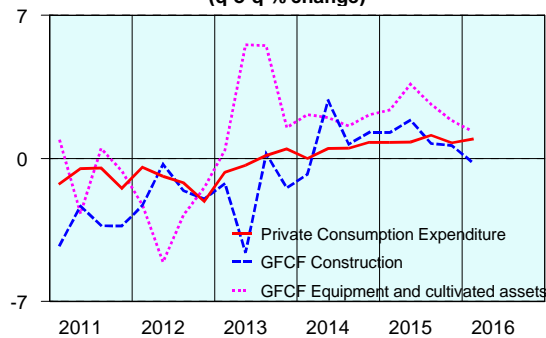

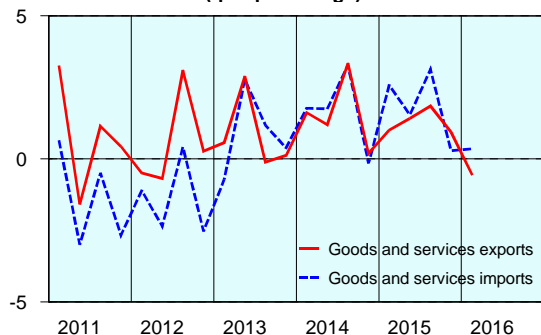
GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT AND COMPONENTS



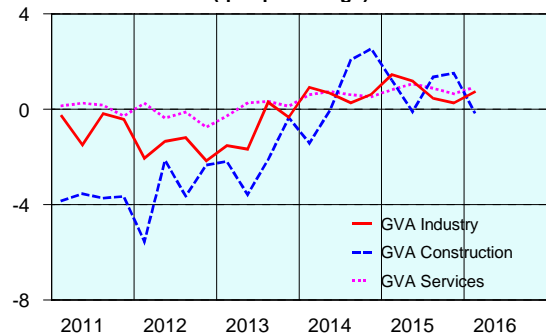
DOMESTIC DEMAND: COMPONENTS (q-o-q % change)

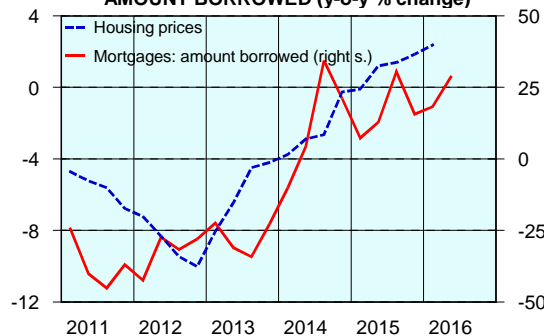

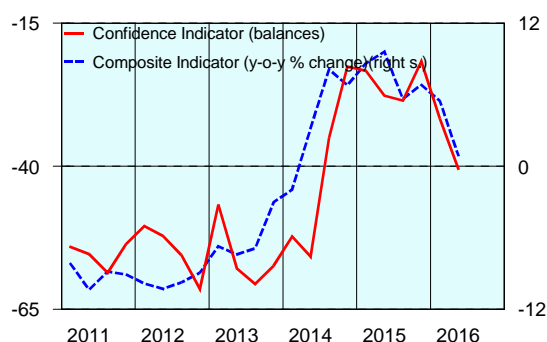
SERVICES: SOCIAL SECURITY COVERED WORKERS AND TURNOVER INDEX (y-o-y % change)

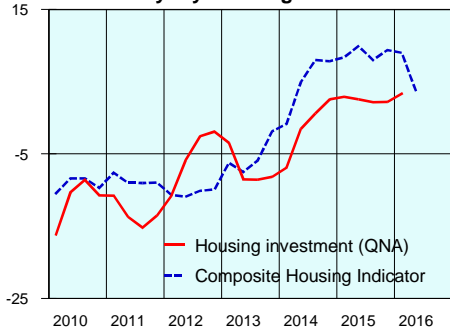
HOUSING. BUILT FOR SALE AND NEW SALES

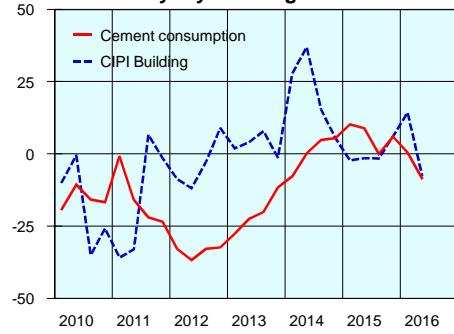
HOUSING STARTS AND ACCRUED
thousands



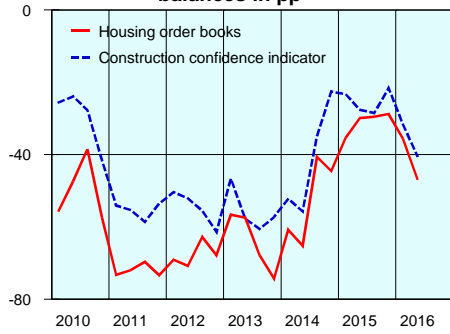
HOUSING INVESTMENT AND COMPOSITE INDICATOR

y-o-y % change



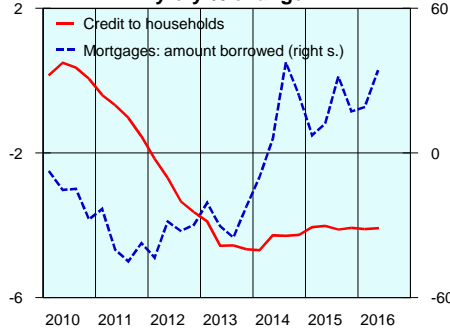

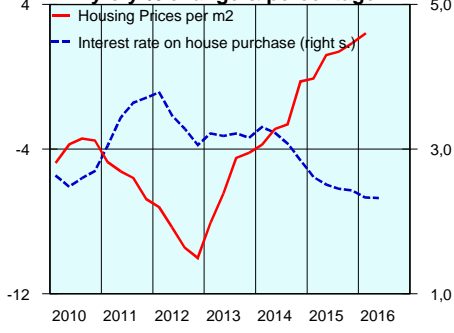
HOUS.FLOORAGE APPROVALS & IPI CLAY BUILDING

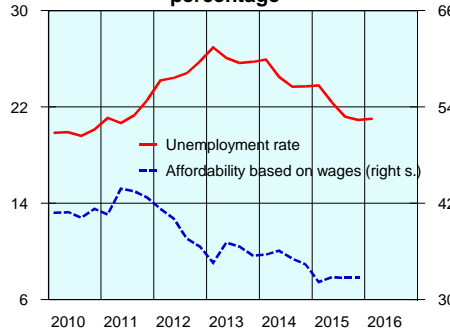
CREDIT FOR HOUSE PURCHASE & MORTGAGES

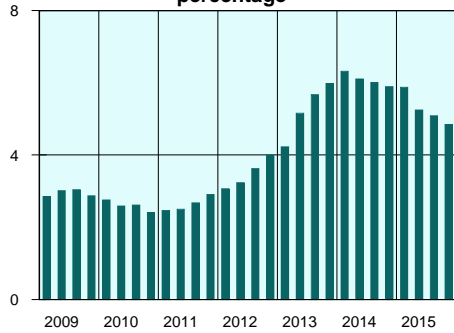
